

Report on Faculty Sensitization Session on Electives

A Faculty Sensitization Session on MBBS Electives was organized by the Medical Education Unit (MEU) under the guidance of the Hon'ble Principal on 5 August 2026 in the MEU Room.

The session was conducted by Dr. Tabassum Bano, Professor & Head, Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology and MEU Member. A total of 21 faculty members from various departments attended. The session was interactive and focused on the NMC guidelines, objectives, planning, implementation, documentation, assessment, and conduct of Electives. Faculty members were also informed about the mandatory minimum 75% attendance required for students to be eligible to appear in the Final MBBS University Examination.

It was decided that a student sensitization session would be conducted on 10 August 2026 at 9:00 AM to orient students regarding the objectives, structure, attendance requirements, and assessment process before the commencement of elective postings.

Faculty Feedback Summary

A total of 17 faculty members submitted feedback. Overall, participants expressed high satisfaction and reported improved understanding of the planning, implementation, assessment, and documentation of Electives.

Key suggestions and observations included:

- Need for continued faculty and student sensitization.
- Importance of developing structured elective modules and separate evaluation methods.
- Challenges anticipated in ensuring student attendance, interest, and informed selection of elective disciplines.
- Recommendation for additional sensitization sessions, more interactive presentations, and hybrid mode participation to enhance faculty engagement.

The feedback indicates that the sensitization programme successfully enhanced faculty preparedness for the effective implementation of the MBBS Electives Programme.
